JCSA BANS THE USE OF BISPHOSPHONATES (INCLUDING TILDREN, OSPHOS, ETC.) WITH IMMEDIATE EFFECT.

The Jockey Club of Saudi Arabia (JCSA) hereby advises that the administration of Bisphosphonates to any horse under its jurisdiction is prohibited with immediate effect.

This prohibition is being implemented in advance of the forthcoming global ban by the International Federation of Horseracing Authorities (IFHA).

With immediate effect :

- No Bisphosphonate product is to be administered to any horse intended to race under JCSA Rules of Racing.
- For the purposes of this notice, Bisphosphonates include, but are not limited to Tildren (tiludronate), Osphos (clodronate), and any other product or formulation containing Bisphosphonate compounds.

Mandatory Reporting of Prior Treatments

All trainers and owners are hereby directed that any horse which has previously received Bisphosphonate treatment must be reported to the Stewards or JCSA Veterinary Services.

Any administration of a Bisphosphonate must be declared, regardless of who authorized or carried out the treatment.

The reporting period shall conclude on **31 July 2026**.

It is critical to note that:

- Any horse not declared during the reporting period, which is subsequently found by the Stewards to have been treated with a Bisphosphonate, or which returns a positive finding to a Bisphosphonate, will be deemed to have been administered the substance after the commencement of this ban.
- In such circumstances, the horse will be subject to disqualification from racing, and the trainer may face disciplinary action, including a possible period of disqualification, for administering a substance that is prohibited at all times.
